### Exercise 22-1 Seeing Clear

Write the list word defined in each of the following (22 marks)

\_\_\_\_\_ 1. From French, formed from lorgner “to squint, peer at,” ultimately from a prehistoric Germanic- a pair of glasses or opera glasses with a short handle at the side.

\_\_\_\_\_ 2. This word means *clear and transparent* and it is often used to describe bodies of water or eyes. It can also describe writing that is *lucid and easy to understand*

\_\_\_\_\_ 3. Archaic meanings of this word, *to blindfold somebody* or *to conceal or hide something* have given way to more figurative definition of *deceiving or duping somebody, especially by trickery*

\_\_\_\_\_ 4. In Greek mythology, *a one hundred-eyed monster, or somebody who is very alert and watchful ( literary )*

\_\_\_\_\_ 5. James Bond’s line of work, or a noun meaning *the use of spying or spies to gather secret information*

\_\_\_\_\_ 6. What you see is not always what you get! This word means *clearly seen or understood* and can also mean *appearing to show particular qualities, feelings, or attributes that may not be genuine.*

\_\_\_\_\_ 7. While you probably know this word in its sense of *amazing someone*, here it is relevant as a verb meaning *to make somebody temporarily unable to see*. It can also be a noun meaning *very bright light that deprives somebody of sight temporarily.*

\_\_\_\_\_ 8. *To see something happen, especially a crime or an accident (verb), or the person doing the seeing (noun)*

\_\_\_\_\_ 9. *An unobstructed view extending in all directions, especially of a landscape.* The term was coined in the late 1780s by an Irish artist, Robert Barker, to describe a method he had invented for painting a scene on the inside of a cylinder in such a way that its perspective would seem correct to someone viewing it from inside the cylinder.

\_\_\_\_\_ 10. *A brief look.*

\_\_\_\_\_ 11. From Latin , literally “to separate off,” this verb means *to see or notice something unclear, to understand something that is not immediately obvious and to be able to tell the difference between two or more things*

\_\_\_\_\_ 12. Also called a cockatrice, this is *a legendary reptile whose look or breath was supposed to be fatal.* It is also the name of *a tropical American lizard, related to the iguana, that is able to run upright on its long hind legs. The males have an inflatable crest at the back of the head.*

\_\_\_\_\_ 13. *shortness of sight or lack of foresight or long-term planning*

\_\_\_\_\_ 14. A very hard word to spell correctly, it means *relating to the eyes, or located in the region of the eye*

\_\_\_\_\_ 15. Looking inwardly; *the detailed mental self-examination of feelings, thoughts, and motives*

\_\_\_\_\_ 16. *acuteness of discernment or perception.*

\_\_\_\_\_ 17. From a Latin root meaning “to darken”, this word now means *to make something obscure or unclear, especially by making it unnecessarily complicated*

\_\_\_\_\_ 18. *to look or smile in a way that suggests unpleasantly lustful or malicious intent*

\_\_\_\_\_ 19. There are lots of meanings for this multifunctional noun: *1. an act of showing or demonstrating something, 2. the state or condition of being shown or perceptible, 3. an indication that something is present, real, or exists, 4. a public demonstration, usually over a political issue, 5. a supposed appearance in visible form by a spiritual being, 6. a visible form in which a divine being, idea, or person is believed to be revealed or expressed*

\_\_\_\_\_ 20. This word is similar in meaning to 18 but has a subtle difference, in meaning *to look at somebody for sexual enjoyment or as a way of showing sexual interest*

\_\_\_\_\_ 21. *somebody’s knowledge or understanding*

\_\_\_\_\_ 22. This term has taken on martial connotations, meaning *the exploration or examination of an area, especially to gather information about the strength and positioning of enemy forces.* It need not be a wartime act, as it also means *a preliminary inspection of a given area to obtain data concerning geographic, hydrographic, or similar information prior to a detailed or full survey*
